How is the \$65 Membership Fee used?

The first thing to note is that Golden Key International Honour Society is a non-profit organization. All the money that goes into the system is used for running GK internationally and locally.

The Berkeley Chapter receives \$16 of each member's \$65 lifetime membership fee. \$2 of the leftover goes specifically to local scholarships. With the \$16 per new member, our local budget funds the cost of attending international and regional GK conferences, putting on our annual

Induction Ceremony, holding social and Honorary Member events, printing our newsletters, and feeding members at meetings. We also reward active members with subsidized honor cords & honor stoles to wear at graduation!

At the international level, GK awards over \$400,000 annually in scholarships. Membership fees are also used to grow corporate and non-profit partnerships (19 to date) which provide member benefits. Headquarters is responsible for printing the international CONCEPTS magazine,

printing and mailing tons of correspondence, subsidizing 13 annual conferences, and paying the operational staff for running headquarters.

Another thing to note is that GK is not sponsored by the ASUC at Cal, and therefore, we are not supported by ASUC funding in any way, shape, or form. The society is pretty much self-sufficient on our membership fees.

So what does this all mean? Come out to GK events! You've paid for them already. ■


