From April 1st-April 3rd, I helped represent the UC Berkeley Chapter at the Golden Key Regional Convention held in Denver, Colorado.



Members have also feasted at GK-sponsored dinners with Honorary Members, Associate Vice Chancellor Black and Professor Bob Jacobsen (Physics).






The late, **Alan Dundes**, speaking at a GK mini-lecture in February.

The Legacy of GK Honorary Member: Professor Alan Dundes

On Wednesday, March 30th, Golden Key was sad to say goodbye to one of its own. Professor **Alan Dundes**, world-renown folklorist, Anthropology faculty, and active Golden Key Honorary Member, passed away from a heart attack at the age of 70.

The legacy that Dundes leaves behind is immeasurable. Academically, Dundes made a huge impact in the field of modern folklore studies. He expanded our concept of "folklore" beyond superstitions and myths, and recognized the value of modern folklore like T-shirt slogans or ethnic and sexual remarks. His colleagues commend him as "one of the most influential folklorists, indeed one of the most influential minds, the world has known."

Personally, Dundes has inspired the minds and hearts of thousands of UC Berkeley students since he first began teaching here in 1963. In addition to his humor and friendliness, Dundes was loved by his students because of his willingness to know them personally as individuals.

GK Honorary Member Chair, Kelly, had the opportunity to be one of the many to know Dundes on a personal level and had this to say: "Having personally taken several classes with him last year, and worked with him to publish a paper and organize a successful Golden Key Honorary Member event this year, I can attest that he was an outstanding man, and someone I wish to aspire towards in the future."

Just one month before his passing, Dundes participated in Golden Key's lecture series and spoke to members about
